The facility officially opened in April 2022, and adds significantly to our ability to provide holistic care that embraces the customer, their loved ones and our community. To introduce ourselves to local officials and the business community in the area, we held two open houses to showcase our new facility and, more importantly, who we are and what we do. In addition, through a merger completed in January 2023, the Women's Recovery Center in Cleveland became part of The LCADA Way family. WRC

has been serving women with substance use disorder for over 38 years. This acquisition will further expand our life-changing services to the residents of **Cuyahoga County.**

Even though The LCADA Way was still feeling some of the effects of the pandemic, our staff continued to provide high-quality services to each of our customers dayin and day-out with dignity and respect. We recognize that each individual who comes through our doors is not only suffering from the disease of addiction but many other complicated issues as well. To support all of our customers' needs our services are individualized.





We have some more exciting news! We are partnering with the MHARS Board of Lorain County and the Nord Center to build a first-class, state-of-the-art Crisis Detox Center in Lorain County that will serve Northeast Ohio.

Individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis will finally have a **24 hours a day, 7 days a week** facility to go to that can properly serve them and transition them safely back into the community.

To our Board of Directors, staff, community partners and friends, who all play an invaluable role in helping to remove the stigma of addiction and embrace those in our community who want to be free, we say thank you! It takes all of us working together to make a difference!

\$25





Ways to Give



REAL ESTATE
